2018 PEP Annual Gala




Over \$70,000 Raised for PEP

This 2018 Ford E450 Phoenix DRW is completely wheelchair accessible and has upgraded passenger seats, power exterior mirrors, and a back-up camera. It is exactly what we need and more.

Thank you, also, to Ken from Interstate Transportation Equipment, Inc. for making the long drive to deliver this beauty to PEP. We are beyond grateful for this gift. This bus will get our members to PEP and back home safely for many years to come!

New Wall Painted in Memory of Beloved PEP Member

In order to meet the proper code designated by the State Fire Marshal to receive our license, we had to put in a semi-wall in our new building, along with complete some other minor construction. To help offset these construction costs, which will move the licensing process along, the Tiscornia Foundation very generously awarded us a \$10,000 grant. The Tiscornia Foundation is operated by Ed and Jeanne Tiscornia along with several other members of their family. Ed and Jeanne are the Aunt and Uncle of Kelly MacCarthy, a beloved PEP member who passed away unexpectedly on April 21 at the young age of 30. Through conversation with the Tiscornia's and Kevin and Wendy MacCarthy, Kelly's parents, we all agreed the wall would be the perfect opportunity to honor Kelly. We will be applying a plaque on



the wall in memory of Kelly, and we hope to also paint a mural including some of her favorite things, such as flamingos. Several PEP members, along with one of Kelly's favorite staff members, Ms. Mary Jo, helped begin the painting process. We really wish Kelly was here to enjoy the new building, but she is forever in our hearts and memories, and we know she is looking over all of us as we begin this new chapter. Thank you tremendously to the Tiscornia and MacCarthy family for sharing Kelly with us and for this benevolent gesture to PEP.
